Itinerary

The itinerary takes in scenic and historic sites and can vary depending on the weather and access to some areas in wet conditions, but we will endeavour to include all sites.

9 February 2026 - Day One

You will be departing Wellington airport at approx. 1pm on Air Chatham's ATR 72. This flight is approx. 2 hours and 15 minutes in which you will be served a light refreshment. Arrival time on the Chatham's is approx. 3.45pm (Chatham Islands time is 45 min ahead of NZ time).

You will be met by one of your hosts Greg or Rosemarie Horler and transferred to your accommodation which is located 9km south of the main township Waitangi, where you will have time to unwind, relax and take in the great sights with the possibility of a walk along the coastal rocks before the evening meal.



10 February 2026 - Day Two After breakfast which is served between 8.00am and 9.30am we will go north to Kaingaroa. We'll stop at Ocean Mail scenic reserve where you will have a picnic lunch followed by a walk in the DOC reserve where you are able to see the regeneration of the wetlands. From here we will travel to the Dendroglyh Grove which is situated in Hapupu reserve. Then we travel on to Skirmish Bay the place of the first landing of Europeans in 1791 and visit the site of the missionaries and whalers. Our last visit of the day, will be to the only accessible seal colony.

11 February 2026 - Day Three

Today we travel to the North West of the Island to Port Hutt stopping on the way to visit the Basalt Columns. There will be a visit to the Port Hutt fishing village. We will



then travel to the stone mission house which was built around 1866 by German missionaries. From here we will travel to Waitangi West beach which is the most westerly point on the Island, then return to our accommodation to a home cooked meal.



12 February 2026 - Day Four
After breakfast we will travel to
Waitangi to visit the Museum and
surrounding places of interest and
a chance for some retail therapy.
Our last visit will be to Admiral
Gardens.

12 February - Day Five

After breakfast we will travel east to Owenga where we will visit Kopinga Maree (Moriori) on the way for an informative talk. Then on to Owenga to view the statue of Tommy Solomon the last full blooded Moriori. Also a walk through Henga scenic reserve. After this we travel back to our accommodation through the inland road.
